

**POSITION AVAILABLE: OPEN-RANK PROFESSOR IN DANCE STUDIES  
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, RIVERSIDE**

The Department of Dance at the University of California, Riverside, seeks a full time Assistant, Associate or Full Professor in Dance Studies. We seek an active and vibrant scholar who is committed to dance studies, who can complement and extend the range of scholarship currently in the department, and who will help expand notions of what dance studies might be. Areas of scholarship open. We particularly welcome scholars pursuing research that is international in scope and global/global south/non-U.S. focused; that is interested in the intersections of scholarly work and artistic production; and/or that explores relations between dance and technology.

Responsibilities include, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, teaching courses in dance studies (such as dance and race, gender, space, location, nation; political, cultural, historical, and rhetorical approaches to dance studies; dance cultures and cultures of dance; filmic bodies; dance technologies; and choreographing writing; opportunities to teach courses in dance and movement practice also available but not required); directing Ph.D. dissertations; advising students on a quarterly basis; departmental, College, and campus committee service. In addition, an ongoing program of research is required.

Salary: commensurate with education and experience

Qualifications: Ph.D. in dance studies or related field; college teaching experience (experience teaching graduate students preferred); interest in innovative course and program development; potential as an administrator; and interest in working in a diverse, multi-ethnic, international environment.
